#### From the Vicar for April 2022:

#### A daring season

Just over two years now since life as we knew it was turned upside down by a virus, and as many have found their lives radically affected by the cloud of war, we enter another season. Easter, is the season whose central theme is of new beginnings and a radical hope.

Having grown up in a house where musicals of many sorts were part of our sound landscape, I often find songs connecting me to the season. In the 1972 musical Godspell, a troupe of 10 performers together tell the story of Jesus. Based on the gospel of Matthew the performance uses clowning, pantomime, charades, acrobatics, and vaudeville to tell the story of Christ. Godspell is a pageant that moves from moment to moment, a production intended to celebrate good news ('god spell' is Old English for gospel) and weave this God's spell of new hope, new joy, new life over its audience. This is a daring act of resistance – to find even under the cloud of conflict and uncertainty the ways of peace with justice and joy. From one of Godspell's songs, By Your Side:

I shall call the pebble dare ...
We will talk, we will talk together ..about walking dare shall be carried
And when we both have had enough
I will take him from my shoe, singing:
"Meet your new road!"
Then I'll take your hand
Finally glad ..That you are here
By my side

May you find by your side, the Easter message of resurrection, the practice of radical hope, as we begin again.

#### From the Vicar for May2022:

#### Trees be Company

The bright green leaves of the hawthorn are often among the first to open in the spring, but its flowers open relatively late, leading to its alternative name 'May blossom'. It has other names — Quickthorn (because cuttings were 'quick' — Old English for alive), Whitethorn, Hawberry, and even 'Bread and Cheese'. Hawthorn comes from the Saxon word for hedge, and in Britain it is familiar as a hedging plant, though it can also grow tall. It provides a naturally prickly, stockproof barrier and superb cover for roosting and nesting birds. In autumn the fruits, or haws, ripen to scarlet then crimson, and offer vital food for resident birds and winter migrants. Trees such as the hawthorn can help us pay attention to, and mark the seasons well. The poet Mary Oliver says: 'When I among the trees .. I would almost say they save me, and daily'. May is the time to mark Rogationtide — from the word to ask, this is an opportunity to ask for blessing for the land and crops. There is also the custom of 'beating the bounds' which the church has taken on in places to walk around parish boundaries. This is a chance to remember our belonging to community and place; an opportunity to re-connect to and honour the earth and creation; a challenge to work for justice and healing for all creation.

God of the elements, bless us: breathe on us, wash us clean, warm us, root us in your good ground, and nourish our living with holy joy. Amen (© Ruth Burgess)

#### **NEWS FROM ST MARY MAGDALENE CHURCH**

#### **CHURCH SERVICES**

Without wishing to appear too optimistic it is encouraging to see that the number of new cases of Covid-19 is reducing, we must be careful not to become complacent over the situation with which we have all lived for over the past two years. There are still large numbers of cases appearing every day. Although the latest variants such as Omicron are less virulent they do spread more quickly but last shorter periods and there are still cases here in the village as we go to press.

But one of many pluses is that the routine of Church services has at last settled to a regular pattern. Whilst the BCP Holy Communion is currently missing from the fourth Sunday of the month, the other three principle Sundays are back to a regular uniformity of: First Sunday – Family Service; Second Sunday – United Benefice Communion at one of the five churches by rotation; Third Sunday – Family Communion. It makes for easier church going planning plus refreshments following the first and third Sunday services.

On Sunday, 8<sup>th</sup> May we have the first visit to Shires' Edge Benefice by Bishop +Gavin following his recent appointment as Bishop of Dorchester, our area bishop. He will lead the United Benefice Holy Communion at 10.00am that morning at Cropredy.

#### ANNUAL PAROCHIAL CHURCH MEETING

Looking ahead the Church AGM (for short) will be held on Tuesday, 10<sup>th</sup> May at 7.30pm in the Church. This is the occasion when, amongst other matters, the Churchwardens and Parochial Church Council members are elected. Everyone is welcome to attend.

#### **CHURCHYARD**

In recent weeks the Churchyard has looked as beautiful as ever. Despite the relatively cold weather - particularly the wind – the three magnolia bushes bloomed early and strongly. The colour along with better than usual daffodils was lovely but regrettably a harsh frost just before Easter soon saw the end of the flowering.

This can act as a reminder in that the maintenance of the Churchyard is carried out by an entirely voluntary team which, for various reasons, has recently reduced in size. We have recently invested in a new pedestrian mower which we hope will be more efficient – an reliable! #### **CHURCH NAVE LIGHTING**

With many thanks to the Friends of Wardington Church the high level wiring and lighting within the nave has been replaced. Although the only the wiring had been condemned at a recent certificate inspection, the opportunity was taken to replace all the light fittings – not only with LED lamps – but also with spot lamps that also shine upwards so as to illuminate the lovely timber – practically never seen in the winter. The result adds a further dimension to the beauty of the church interior.



Minutes of a meeting of the Parish Council held on Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> February 2022 at 7:30pm at Wardington Village Hall

Present: Cllr Malcolm Patterson (Chairman), Cllr George Martin, Cllr Bob Jarrett.

- 101. Apologies for absence ClIr Julie Burnett, ClIr Nigel Bankes, ClIr George Page. County & District ClIr Reynolds.
- 102. Proposal to co-opt Lexi Gordon-Finlayson onto the Parish Council (PC) Proposed and agreed. Lexi completed her Declaration of Acceptance of Office which was countersigned by the Clerk.
- 103. Members' declarations of interest for items on the agenda Cllr Patterson is the treasurer for the Wardington Garden Club.
- Public participation session None.
- 105. To approve the minutes of the Parish Council (PC) meeting held on 11<sup>th</sup> January 2022 The minutes were proposed, agreed, and duly signed.
- Outstanding matters/actions from previous meetings
- 106.1 Further action to be taken to progress the repair of the wall opposite Yew Tree Cottage and get the footpath cleared it appears that it could take some time to get Highways to do anything about this. Clerk to write to wall owner to ask if they have any idea of when the wall will be repaired.
- 106.2 Defibrillator update The Village Hall Committee have suggested that the defibrillator remain on their insurance so in order to avoid any potential insurance issues it was agreed that it would be best if the Village Hall retained ownership of the defibrillator and the PC donate any required consumables for the defibrillator. Clerk to inform Village Hall Committee.
- 106.3 Signage in a Conservation Area A parishioner has raised concerns about a new sign in the village that they have queried if it is acceptable in a Conservation Area. The PC has looked into this and do not wish to take any action on the sign.

Erection of a general purpose farm building, steel portal frame, spanning off the existing existing barn and to be of similar design and materials: Concrete panel walls with steel profile sheet cladding above (plastic coated, green), under steel profile sheet roof. Access from existing yard of Top Dawkins Farm buildings and using existing site access from highway. Prior approval not required.

## 109. Queen's Platinum Jubilee Celebrations

Clir Chapman advised that the County Council has been looking into promoting 20mph limits in villages who are interested in having their speed limits reduced. 117. To approve the minutes of the Parish Council (PC) meeting held on 15<sup>th</sup> February 2022 – The minutes were proposed, agreed, and duly signed.

It was agreed to discuss item 122.1 at this point in the meeting as this is the item that the parishioner is in attendance to discuss. The parishioner left the meeting at 7:54pm

- 118. Outstanding matters/actions from previous meetings
- 118.1 Further action to be taken to progress the repair of the wall opposite Yew Tree Cottage and get the footpath cleared The Clerk has written to the owner of the wall but has not received any response. Clerk to obtain contact details of other owners and write to them.
- 118.2 Defibrillator update The Memorial Hall Committee have agreed that they will retain ownership and insure the defibrillator and the PC will provide the consumables as and when needed.
- 118.3 Update re installation of Bollards opposite Sundial House There has been no update from Highways re costings. The parishioner who requested this will continue to follow this up.
- 118.4 Update on application for 20mph limits within the parish The Clerk has submitted an application to the scheme and has asked for some further information. The application form included requests for evidence of parish support, details of specific areas in which 20mph would be required, and evidence of accidents in those areas supporting the need for 20 mph. The PC do not currently have that information so may not be accepted onto the scheme at the moment. Clerk to chase up response from Oxfordshire County Council (OCC) if they do not reply within the required timescales.
- 118.5 Hedge trimming around the churchyard extension An informal quote has been received for hedge laying (not bound) which seems appropriate but the work cannot be completed until Autumn due to the possibility of birds nesting. Gerk to e-mail contractor to request a formal quote to be considered at the next meeting.
- 118.6 Update on relocation of the post box outside the Memorial Hall The post box does not feel very secure and there are concerns that it may fall. Clir Malcolm Patterson to contact Royal Mail to ask them to consider relocating the post box and ensuring it is safe.
- 118.7 Update re Platinum Jubilee Celebrations A group of parishioners are organising an event on the field on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> June. Cherwell District Council (CDC) are offering grants to PCs to help with some costs but they must fit within a strict criteria. Clir Malcolm Patterson to complete the activity elements of the application form and pass on to the Clerk to finalise and submit.

- 119. Report on play equipment inspection completed on 9<sup>th</sup> March 2022 The Clerk completed an inspection on 9<sup>th</sup> March. Issues noted were rope trapped in lower part of access gate which required cutting off and bird mess on some items. The items have now been cleaned and the rope removed from the gate.
- **HS2 update** Simon from HS2 has provided a presentation document that HS2 wish to present as part of a village meeting and/or in the Warbler sometime in April. **Clir Bob Jarrett to ask Simon to agree a date for a public meeting and put together an invitation to go out to parishioners** which will need to go out prior to the Warbler due to the next publication being later than the suggested meeting timescale. Simon has also contacted Clir Bob Jarrett advising that they are looking into extended working hours to work full days on Saturday (7:30-6pm) and Sunday (8am-6pm) and asking for the PC's view on this. It was agreed that the PC is totally against any additional weekend working. **Clir Bob Jarrett to advise HS2 of the PC view and make Clir George Reynolds and Victoria Prentis MP aware of this request to ask for their support in preventing this from going ahead.**


